Osage Nation Foundation Schedules First Fundraiser

The Osage Nation Foundation, established in 2005 by the Osage Nation to serve as a charitable extension of the Nation and reconstituted in 2011, has scheduled its first fundraiser.

The Foundation will have its first annual charity golf tournament Monday, April 23 at Tulsa Country Club in Tulsa. The event will utilize a four-person scramble format and kick-off at 12:30 p.m. with a shotgun start. Registration opens at 10 a.m. with lunch served at 11 a.m.

“The goal is for the Foundation to eventually become a self-sustaining organization,” said Bill Webb, Osage Foundation Executive Director. “So our first objective has to be to begin the process of raising money. We will have other ways to raise funds but this is a very visible and enjoyable way to spread the word about the Foundation while starting the process of funding our activities.”

The site of the event, Tulsa Country Club, has been a landmark in Tulsa for more than 100 years and its 18-hole A.W. Tillinghast designed course has recently undergone a total renovation.

Sponsorships are available for those wishing to support the Foundation, ranging from \$5,000 for the Golden Eagle sponsorship down to an individual playing spot for \$95 which includes lunch. The Foundation is governed by a Board of Directors which is responsible for executing the mission and objectives of the Foundation.
